**Aquatic:** Training continued for our Master swimmers and members of the Swim clubs as scheduled.

Learn to swim classes for Schools Groups has been scheduled on a term basis and began in September 2023. Lessons were offered five days per week, Mondays to Fridays. Lessons for individuals were increased from five days per week to six days per week. Mondays to Saturdays. #### YOUTH DEVELOPMENT PROGRAMME

The YMCA Youth Development Programme (formerly the Street Corner Boys' Programme) continued with fulltime classes. The new school year began in September 2023.

The programme in partnership with HEART Trust/NSTA provided Educational, Recreational and Life Coping Skills to approximately 35 male students, ages 11 -15 years old. A significant reduction in the school population. The programme was administered with the use of best practises teaching methods in Literacy, Numeracy, Computer Technology, Barbering Techniques, Guidance Counselling, Swimming and Badminton, during the year.



The programme continued to have a 100% pass rate of students being successful in the Grade Nine Achievement Test (GNAT) set by the Ministry of Education for placement in high schools in and around the corporate area.

35 students sat the Examinations in 2023, were successful and gained entries into High Schools of their choices, and in near proximity to their homes.

Heartiest Congratulations to every students for their achievement!



#### <u>Challenges</u>

Some students were often absent from school and this created a weakened interest in their educational development.

The behaviors displayed by the students at times resulted in damage to school furniture and the physical plant.

#### **Concerns**

Financial constraints being experienced by some of our parents contributed to their inability to provided breakfast for their child or ward to attend school.

Students were able to obtain breakfast at school, for a minimal fee.

### LATIN AMERICAN AND CARIBBEAN ALLIANCE OF YMCAS AFTERSCHOOL PROGRAMME/JAMAICA

The programme was set up for YMCAs, sponsored by the YMCA of the Latin American and Caribbean (YMCA LAC) in partnership with CIBC/FCIB.

The commitment was to strengthening the impact of YMCAs in the region through a programme designed to impact At Risk Youth.



The Kingston YMCA operate its Afterschool Programme at two locations – 21 Hope Road, Kingston 10 and at the Boys' Town Outreach Centre, 6 Collie Smith Drive, Kingston 12, in the parish of St. Andrew.

At 21 Hope Road, Eighteen (18) students from our Youth Development Programme (YDP), who live in and around Kingston & St. Andrew communities, such as Papine, Red Hills Road, Cassava Piece, Mountain View and Swallowfield, participated in scheduled activities such as Guidance and Counselling/Personal Development, Computer Technology, Phonics, Mathematics and Swimming.



The students attended the programme two days per week over the year. A proposed increased, from the previous year one day per week.

Boys' Town activities included 31 students who attended regularly of which two (2) were girls. These youngsters live in close proximity to the Boys' Town community, namely, Wilton Gardens, Federal Gardens, Rose Town, Arnett Gardens, Trench Town and Denham Town which made it easy for that group to attend the activities regularly.



The students attended the programme three days per week, Mondays, Tuesdays, and Thursdays between the hours of 1:30 pm - 3:30 pm. and once per month on Saturdays, for mentorship sessions.

Nutritional support were provided for the children at both Centres.



#### LEADERSHIP TRAINING PROGRAMME APRIL – JUNE 2023

The Kingston YMCA carried out its Leadership Development Training Programme during the months of April to June 2023. Over 30 young people between the ages of 14-25 years of age were engaged in the training. The 10 week Training Programme was conducted as part of our preparations for our 2023 Summer Camp scheduled for July and August.






# Burger King/YMCA Preparatory & Primary Schools Swim Meet 2023


